



Pannonia Inferior (4th c.AD) (4th c.AD) Caucasus (1st c.BC) Macedonia 1st c.BC to China (7th - 12th c.AD) to India (probably late Roman era) again in 458 BC LEGEND: (to Egypt from Babylonia) Cyrenaica - region with Jewish presence until 1st c.AD region with Jewish presence until 1st c.AD According to Philo of Alexandria, China - region with Jewish presence after 1st c.AD disputed, between 5th c.BC & 1st c.AD in the 1st c.AD Jews in Egypt Romaniotes - name of a regional group of Jews numbered ca. 1 million, 12% of Alexandria - city with a Jewish community the total population, including 200 thousand in Alexandria -Approximate directions of Jewish migrations, deportations, population movements, etc. 40% of the city's population. Approximate time when Jewish presence is confirmed or when a population movement started. 




Christian Diaspora 300-600 AD






