For more than a century God has used independent Open Brethren heritage churches to grow his Church in Aotearoa, New Zealand. Men, women and children have faithfully proclaimed and lived out faith in Jesus Christ, through the gospel, from the Scriptures.

This is the rich heritage of more than 160 churches, and the regional campsites and ministries that support them. We're thankful for a rich heritage of believers who were committed to the Scriptures and led by the Holy Spirit.

Today, Christian Community Churches of New Zealand is a movement that reflects this heritage and seeks to encourage local churches, campsites and ministries to work together to reach New Zealand for Jesus Christ.

We are a movement of independent local churches, each with God-given leadership, and yet we are united by the good news of Jesus—his death and resurrection.

We are not a denominational structure exercising authority over churches. Our staff team works amongst the churches in our movement. Our desire is to invite each church into interdependent relationships with each other with the aim of seeing people reached for Christ.

We call this process linking in.

Our hope is that you'll see the ways your church can be further supported and strengthened by linking in with like-minded churches, campsites and ministries. This could include ministry support, fellowship, shared resources, funding... and much more!

This booklet will walk through the link in process, highlight some of the important things to consider, and give you a glimpse of what linking in might mean for your church.

WHO IS CCCNZ?

Christian Community Churches of New Zealand is a movement of independent local churches, and the regional camps and national ministries that support them, working together to reach New Zealand for Jesus Christ.

CCCNZ VISION

To reach New Zealand for Jesus Christ.

CCCNZ MISSION

To see churches working together to plant new churches, to see existing churches flourish, and to develop new leaders.



HOW WE WORK TOGETHER

TOGETHER WORKS BETTER

Our desire is to see independent churches supporting and encouraging each other, in order to be better equipped for gospel growth and ministry. Our desire is to see each church supported to go and make disciples of Jesus Christ in their suburb, town, marae or city.

Linking in to CCCNZ connects you to a growing number of independent churches, and the regional campsites and national ministries that support them. CCCNZ is made up of ordinary women and men from all around Aotearoa, New Zealand.

GOVERNANCE AND STRUCTURE

We're passionate about serving local churches!

The CCCNZ movement is served by the CCCNZ Service Trust. The CCCNZ Trust Board was established in 2016 and is made up of six elected members and six appointed members from among our churches. Linked in churches vote on governance of the trust at the Annual General Meeting. The Trust Board governs the direction of the CCCNZ Staff Team, a team of people led by the Ambassador, who is accountable to the Trust Board.

The CCCNZ Staff Team seeks to support and develop local, regional, and national networks of elders, pastors, administrators, youth workers, young adults, children and family ministry workers. Our heart is that these leaders would connect with each other—the wealth of amazing people from around the movement serving in similar roles.

Our desire is to see resources developed and shared, prayer offered, and relationships nurtured with the shared vision of reaching New Zealand for Christ.

The CCCNZ Staff Team and Trust Board are not a hierarchical authority enforcing compliance to a set of organisational obligations. The Staff Team and Trust Board exist to serve and support, and simply work amongst the churches.

Each church, campsite and national ministry has freedom and autonomy to choose what to take from CCCNZ, how to participate, and what to offer to other churches.

THE GOSPEL

We value the message of Christ crucified. At the heart of the gospel is the message of what God has done in Jesus through his death and resurrection. The proclamation of this message from Scripture is the means by which the Spirit works in the world.

THE BIBLE

We value the Bible. We encounter the living Lord Jesus through the gospel, by the Spirit, from the Scriptures. We are taught by the Scriptures and led by the Spirit. We disciple and evangelise with and through the Bible, in the power of the Spirit. The Bible is at the heart of our mission and our ministries.

TEAM LEADERSHIP

We value team leadership. Team leadership recognises a variety of roles and gifts: discipling,

shepherding, teaching etc. Team leadership is actively involved in reaching, growing and sending younger leaders.

TEAM MINISTRY

We value seeing every member of every church being reached, grown, sent out together, trained, equipped, motivated and empowered for vital involvement in real ministry, in the church, marketplace, and wider society.

TEAM MISSION

We send people together into mission locally and globally. We participate in the mission of God together with simplicity, flexibility, and freedom.

WHAT WE DO

In working to serve and support our movement we are active in the following areas.

CHURCH PLANTING

We're passionate about seeing the Church grow through church planting and revitalisation. Practically, CCCNZ helps churches to plant new churches through the assessing, resourcing and coaching of church planters.

PRAYER

The CCCNZ Prayer Coordinator serves to support churches and ministries in a flourishing prayer life. There is a growing group of people praying together weekly from across the CCCNZ movement, seeking to spur each other on and encourage churches to be places of prayer. We also facilitate Regional Prayer Gatherings—where people gather from different churches to pray and encourage one another in prayer.

YOUTH

CCCNZ wants to see youth leaders and youth pastors working with people from across the generations to evangelise and disciple youth by pointing them to Jesus, through the gospel, from the Bible. We do this primarily through coaching, training and consultancy. The CCCNZ Youth Enabler works with the National Youth Team to support local youth ministries to flourish and thrive.

CHILDREN AND FAMILY MINISTRIES

We serve, equip, train, resource, encourage and support those who minister with children and families in the CCCNZ movement. We want to see Children and Family Ministries thrive and grow and be places where children encounter God and are welcomed as valued members of intergenerational faith communities.

TRAINING AND SCHOLARSHIPS

Building a culture of training new leaders and equipping people to minister to each other is ideal, but can often be hard to develop, which is why we support churches and individuals to pursue ministry training in a variety of ways. These include developing pathways for people wanting further training and facilitating scholarships.

PRACTICAL RESOURCES

We understand that changing administrative requirements are a growing concern for many churches. We offer a range of practical resources and support in the areas of Health and Safety, Financial Reporting, Compliance, Employment and Cost Saving Resources.

CCCNZ PASTORLINK

CCCNZ PastorLINK is a growing network of pastors supporting pastors. From yearly retreats for pastors and their spouses, to regular support and contact from others who understand the joys and challenges of pastoral work.

WHY WOULD AN INDEPENDENT CHURCH LINK IN TO A MOVEMENT?

MINISTRY NETWORKS

We offer local, regional, and national networks that offer care, support and practical resources for elders, pastors, administrators, prayer teams, youth pastors/ leaders, children and families ministries, and young adult leaders.

CHURCH PLANTING AND REVITALISATION

Practical support is available to churches considering planting, including consultation about models and approach. We offer support and training to planters through networking and forums.

Our partner Lichfield Lands has seed funding available for church planting. To be eligible for this funding, a church plant must be formally linked in to CCCNZ. Recognition gives a plant some of the support and benefits of affiliation without them needing to have a formal constitution.

DEVELOPING LEADERS

We assist local churches in their vital task of training up gospel-shaped leaders. We facilitate events, coaching and training that serves to support local leaders as they disciple emerging leaders throughout the year.

We make available funding grants for informal training to upskill younger leaders and existing leaders. Through the JH Baldwin scholarships offered by our partners Lichfield Lands and Hillview Trust we seek to see the next generation of leaders being developed.

ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT

CCCNZ offers resources and support with health and safety, employment, financial planning, compliance, licensing and cost saving. The online CCCNZ Administration Resource Library is full of up to date and useful templates and tools. We recognise that faithful governance and administration is a ministry of care which releases others. We offer training and practical support for churches looking to grow in this.

MUTUAL RESOURCING

Within the movement's churches, campsites and support ministries there are practical, pastoral and financial resources constantly being shared. We aim to strengthen the connection between local churches, regional campsites, and national ministries—for the benefit of ministry, leadership training and building up the Church.

Some examples of how this might work practically:

- Particular campsites offering churches their sites for a koha (gift)
- Funders that are keen to invest into local church training and evangelistic initiatives
- National ministries keen to invest into your local church
- Stewards Property Trust is keen to partner with churches considering church planting
- Various campsites are keen to bless pastoral couples seeking respite or refreshment
- Funding trusts that are keen to support evangelistic efforts that involve both churches and campsites
- Churches with experience and resources for reaching specific ethnic groups are keen to support and share with other churches seeking to do the same

RESPONSIBILITIES OF LINKING IN

Elder and Lead Pastor, Howick Community Church, Auckland Linking in is open to all Open Brethren heritage Churches, regional campsites and ministries, as well as other independent churches and campsites who are approved by the board and who agree to our movement's vision, mission, statement of faith and values.

We passionately support and affirm the independence of local churches, regional camps and ministries. At the same time, we are an inter-dependent movement. In the healthiest way possible we need each other if we are to reach our region for Christ. Therefore, every church that links in has commitments to the wider movement locally, regionally and nationally.

A COMMITMENT TO PRAY:

CCCNZ churches pray together for each other.

A COMMITMENT TO COME TOGETHER:

CCCNZ churches work together to reach their region for Christ.

CCCNZ churches come together in local, regional, and national gatherings.

CCCNZ churches help get the word out about CCCNZ local, regional, and national gatherings.

A COMMITMENT TO GROW LEADERS:

CCCNZ church leaders participate together in local, regional, and national gatherings.

CCCNZ churches invite younger leaders to CCCNZ events, initiatives, and forums.

A COMMITMENT TO SHARE:

CCCNZ churches take a gospel-shaped approach to sharing their resources with one another.

CCCNZ church leaders participate in CCCNZ retreats, forums, and initiatives through mutual giving and receiving.



OUR SHARED DNA

CCCNZ is not a denomination. We have no central control over churches, national ministries and regional campsites. We affirm the role of Godappointed leaders of churches, camps and ministries to make decisions about ministry and mission in their context.

Our heart is that churches that link in to CCCNZ would share our convictions and vision to reach New Zealand for Jesus Christ. This includes agreeing to our Statement of Faith.

STATEMENT OF FAITH

We believe, affirm and teach:

1.

God is. He exists as One God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. He is almighty and has need of nothing. He is eternal and he is Love.

2.

God, who is Spirit, has chosen to create space and time and matter, and all that exists. He has planned this in his wisdom and created all things by His power. He has life in himself, and all life has its source in him. He continues to be Lord and active sustainer of this world and all that he has made.

3.

The crown of God's creation is humanity, whom he has made in his image to reflect his glory. He made Adam and Eve male and female, and breathed into them the spirit of life so that they became living souls capable of enjoying a personal relationship with him. He established the relationship of man and woman in marriage as a covenant. He also gave them the power of choice which, tragically, they used to disobey him, and in so doing passed on their fallen nature to all humanity.

4.

Jesus Christ, the eternal Son of God, came to earth to be the Saviour of the world. He is the complete revelation of God in human form (John 1:18). He was conceived of the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary, fully God and fully human. He lived among us on this earth, fulfilling the will of God, speaking the words of God, and doing the works of God.

5.

He was crucified—an act of sinful men—but his death was also his own act of obedience to God by which he offered himself as a sacrifice for our sins and for the sins of the whole world. He was raised to life again by the power of God, on the third day, left the tomb and, after showing himself alive to his disciples, ascended to heaven, whereby God has bestowed on him a name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

6.

God planned, before the world was created, that there should be a way of salvation for sinful people. We are accountable for our choices, but we are totally unable to achieve peace with God by our own efforts. God has acted in grace and chosen to call men and women into his family and kingdom. At the same time, he invites all people to respond to him by faith in Jesus Christ. Redemption from the guilt, penalty, dominion and pollution of sin, is solely through the sacrificial death of the Lord Jesus Christ, the incarnate Son of God, as our representative and substitute.

7.

As we receive salvation, we are justified, forgiven, born of God, and have the gift of eternal life. By the Spirit of God, we begin to be changed to live according to God's design, and to become like Christ. Our growing likeness to Jesus Christ is evidence of our coming into relationship with God. God's greatest requirement of us is that we love him with all of our heart, and that we love our neighbours as ourselves.

8.

At the time that anyone receives the gift of salvation, the Holy Spirit comes to dwell within them. It is by the Spirit of God that we are born again. The Holy Spirit is eternal and divine. He reveals Jesus Christ, God's Son to us. He teaches the truth and communicates the life and power of God to us.

9.

The Holy Spirit has inspired the Scriptures (the Old and New Testaments). The Scriptures are God's Word. They are sufficient for our guidance and are our final authority in all matters of faith and conduct. Scripture is true and fully reliable. We do not judge Scripture—rather, we stand under its judgement, and seek in humility to understand it by the Holy Spirit's aid, and then obey.

10.

All who have received salvation become members of Christ's church. They are his disciples. To them is given the task and privilege of being his ambassadors to represent their master to the world, and to proclaim the good news of reconciliation to God through Jesus Christ, God's Son, and his sacrifice.

The Church functions as a body. God, by his Spirit, gives gifts which equip every member to contribute to the church's ministry, and, for the church to be healthy, every member must be playing his or her part. All believers are priests, with access to God in prayer and worship solely on the ground of the sacrifice of Jesus Christ, God's Son. The typical pattern of church government, presented by the New Testament, is that



of oversight by a group of elders. This provides the pattern for church leadership in our own day. The Lord Jesus Christ has asked his disciples to remember him regularly in the celebration of the Lord's Supper (or Communion). This is a focus of the shared spiritual life of the Church and expresses the unity of believers in Jesus Christ. Baptism by immersion in water is a symbolic act in which believers publicly declare their commitment to the Lord Jesus Christ.

11.

Evil is real. Satan, the enemy of God, is active in this world. There is a hell, as well as a heaven. But Satan, sin and death have been overcome by Jesus Christ, God's Son, in his death and resurrection.

12.

The salvation which God has planned for his people, is not yet complete. The Lord Jesus Christ will soon return to this world as King of kings. Evil is yet to be finally put down in a process of judgement and, in this process, God's people are vindicated. God's promises to his covenant people will be fulfilled in a way that demonstrates God's faithfulness. God's wise justice will be vindicated and his people's salvation perfected. The dead will be raised—those who have been born of God to eternal joy, and the unrepentant to eternal sorrow. Creation will be renewed, and there will be a new heaven and a new earth. All creatures will sing God's praise.

FAQ



Still not sure? Take a look through these frequently asked questions or get in touch with us to work through the details of what it means to be linked in to CCCNZ.

WE'RE A CHURCH WITH AN OPEN BRETHREN HERITAGE. DO WE STILL NEED TO LINK IN TO CCCNZ?

Does having an Open Brethren heritage mean a church is automatically linked in? No.

We support and affirm each church's independent structure and leadership, which is why linking in is an opt-in decision, not a forced or automatic one.

We recommend a church and its leadership team take time to get to know CCCNZ. Read the website, understand our doctrinal statement, vision, and values. Download the Trust Deed and subscribe to newsletters. Chat with churches that have already linked in. Don't hesitate to talk with the CCCNZ Staff Team or Trust Board members. Once your leadership team is ready, one of the CCCNZ Board or Staff will make a time to visit your leadership team and talk through the opportunities and responsibilities of linking in.

Once you are ready to link in we invite your eldership team to sign the document and return it to us.

WE'RE AN INDEPENDENT CHURCH WITHOUT AN OPEN BRETHREN HERITAGE. CAN WE LINK IN?

We'd like to invite your elders to write a signed letter to CCCNZ with your request to link in with the CCCNZ Trust. We'd ask that your statement of faith, documentation of vision and mission, and a brief history of your church accompanies this signed letter.

Linking in with CCCNZ affirms that you are not primarily affiliated to another movement or organisation, and that the CCCNZ movement will be your primary affiliation.

We will send you a copy of our Trust Deed and Statement of Faith. Our Ambassador and a board member will visit your eldership and church. If you are not well-known to us, we'll ask about your doctrine, vision and values, and for external referees etc. We'd love to chat about what your church can bring to the CCCNZ family. This will not be a one-way process! We'd love your leaders to have questions for us.

Based on your application, and time spent together, the Ambassador and board member will make a recommendation for the CCCNZ Board to consider. The Ambassador and the team will notify you of their decision in writing.

WHAT DOES IT COST TO LINK IN TO CCCNZ?

CCCNZ charges NO membership fee or ongoing financial commitment for linking in.

How do you continue to offer support?

To be able to continue serving and supporting churches, CCCNZ does need an income. CCCNZ is generously supported through a number of trusts, individuals, churches and families. We are so grateful to God for his provision to us through the faithful support of his people.

If you, or your church, are able to give financially to supporting the movement we welcome this contribution.

However, we recognise that not every church, campsite or national ministry is in this position.

Our perspective is that when a church, campsite or national ministry links in with CCCNZ it brings more than money. It brings experiences, it brings prayers, and it brings resources of people and ministries.

Linking in is a commitment to joining the wider movement in the mission to reach New Zealand for Jesus Christ.

WILL CCCNZ REMOVE OUR ABILITY TO MAKE DECISIONS ABOUT OUR CHURCH?

No. CCCNZ is not a hierarchal authority structure or denomination.

CCCNZ affirms and supports the God-given leadership appointed in each independent local church. This means your leadership or eldership team are the ones making the decisions. We offer a range of benefits, support and fellowship for you to link into. This includes everything from administrative support and resourcing; coaching for leaders; training for young people; support and connection for pastoral staff... What you choose to take is up to you. One church describes this as a Pick 'n' Mix, where leaders can choose what they need.

Our heart is that churches sharing our vision and mission, and a similar heritage, would choose to link in with others for the sake of seeing people in New Zealand come to know Jesus, through the gospel, from the Scriptures.

CCCNZ IS ONLY FOR SMALL CHURCHES, RIGHT?

Maybe you're a larger church that is well-resourced and equipped: What's the point in linking in with CCCNZ?

There is a great diversity in the churches linked in to CCCNZ. From large city churches with many congregations, to smaller churches in regional towns. There are churches where services are held in languages other than English, churches where there are mostly older people, churches where there is a mix of ages, churches with community outreaches...

For some larger churches, an important part of being linked in is about sharing in God's work on a regional and national level. Some larger churches are interested in church planting and want to connect with others on a similar journey for support and encouragement.

A key benefit of linking in is the mutual sharing and encouragement churches receive from connection with each other. There is also access to support when facing some of the logistical issues that come with a growing church family, such as navigating legal issues, pay scale advice, or health and safety requirements. All these things—and more—are available when you link in to CCCNZ.

CCCNZ IS ONLY FOR LARGE CHURCHES, RIGHT?

Maybe you're a smaller church and wondering what place you could have within the CCCNZ movement?

There is a great diversity in the churches linked in to CCCNZ. From large city churches with many congregations, to smaller churches in regional towns. There are churches where services are held in languages other than English, churches where there are mostly older people, churches where there is a mix of ages, churches with community outreaches...

CCCNZ is not about taking individual churches and forcing them to look like each other. We believe healthy and flourishing churches exist at every size and in every context. As a smaller church you may be looking for administrative support, or like-minded speakers, others from your region to pray with, or similar churches to mutually encourage. All these things—and more—are available when you link in to CCCNZ.

We respect and honour that decision.


